Participation Guidelines

1. All participants must be 18 years of age or older.
2. Hours of service are recorded on a "service year" basis from September 1 to August 31 of the following year.
3. Service hours may not be carried over to succeeding service years.
4. One recognition per service year per person may be earned
5. Order of the Arrow workdays (Fix It) and conferences do not count toward total hours worked.
6. Service hours may be accumulated at Bear Paw, Gardner Dam, Twin Lakes, Cub Scout World Camp Rokilio, or Maywood Wilderness.

Recognition Awards for service at any Property or combination of Properties

1. 20 hours of service – Camp Engineers Council Shoulder Strip
2. 40 hours of service – Camp Engineers Society T-shirt
3. 60 hours of service – Camp Engineers Society Hat
4. 80 hours of service – Camp Engineers Society Hooded Sweatshirt
5. 100 hours of service – Camp Engineers Society Light Jacket

Recognition items will be awarded at the Order of the Arrow Fall Conference. The first year begins on September 1, 2004. Camp Rangers and caretakers will be responsible for recording hours.
